

ORDER DIRECTING EXPEDITED ANSWER


This emergency, original petition for a writ of mandamus challenges certain Nye County voting procedures to be implemented during the November 2022 election. In particular, petitioners challenge the verbal, public announcement of the selected candidate during the hand-counting process, the limitation on the use of ADA touch screens, and the signature verification process as violative of state and federal laws.

Having reviewed the petition, it appears that an answer may assist this court in resolving this matter. Therefore, respondents shall have until 12 noon on Wednesday, October 19, 2022, to file and serve an answer, including authorities, against issuance of the requested writ. NRAP



21(b)(1). Petitioners shall have until 9 am on Thursday, October 20, 2022, to file and serve any reply. No extensions of time will be granted.¹
