Before the Court is the parties' joint Stipulation to Stay Proceedings and Extend Pending Deadlines (Doc. 31), in which they request a 60-day stay of proceedings and extension of pending deadlines.

This Court previously granted the parties' first stipulation to stay proceedings until December 9, 2024, on which date the stay was to be automatically lifted. (Doc. 26 at 1). However, the parties have provided this Court with no reason to institute an additional stay in this case, especially given that the parties have agreed to an extension of the upcoming deadlines.

Additionally, given that the deadlines for Plaintiffs to respond to the Motion to Intervene (Doc. 19) and for Defendant to answer the Complaint (Doc. 1) were already extended (*see* Doc. 26), it is entirely unclear why an additional lengthy extension of over 60 days for both deadlines is needed. The parties' explanation that the extension "will permit the parties to work in good faith to address issues related to the availability and provision of voter records requested by Citizen AG" is vague and unconvincing, especially

1	given that the voter records were already served on Plaintiff (Doc. 27). (Doc. 31 at 2).
2	Accordingly,
3	IT IS ORDERED that the parties' Stipulation to Stay Proceedings and Extend
4	Pending Deadlines (Doc. 31) is <b>granted in part and denied in part</b> as follows:
5	1. The Clerk of Court is directed to <b>lift the stay</b> on the case pursuant to the Court's
6	previous Order (Doc. 26);
7	2. Responses to the Motion to Intervene as Defendants by One Arizona and the
8	Arizona Alliance for Retired Americans (Doc. 19) shall be due on January 3,
9	<b>2025</b> ; and
10	3. Defendant's Answer or other response to Plaintif's Complaint (Doc. 1) shall
11	be due on <b>January 10, 2025</b> .
